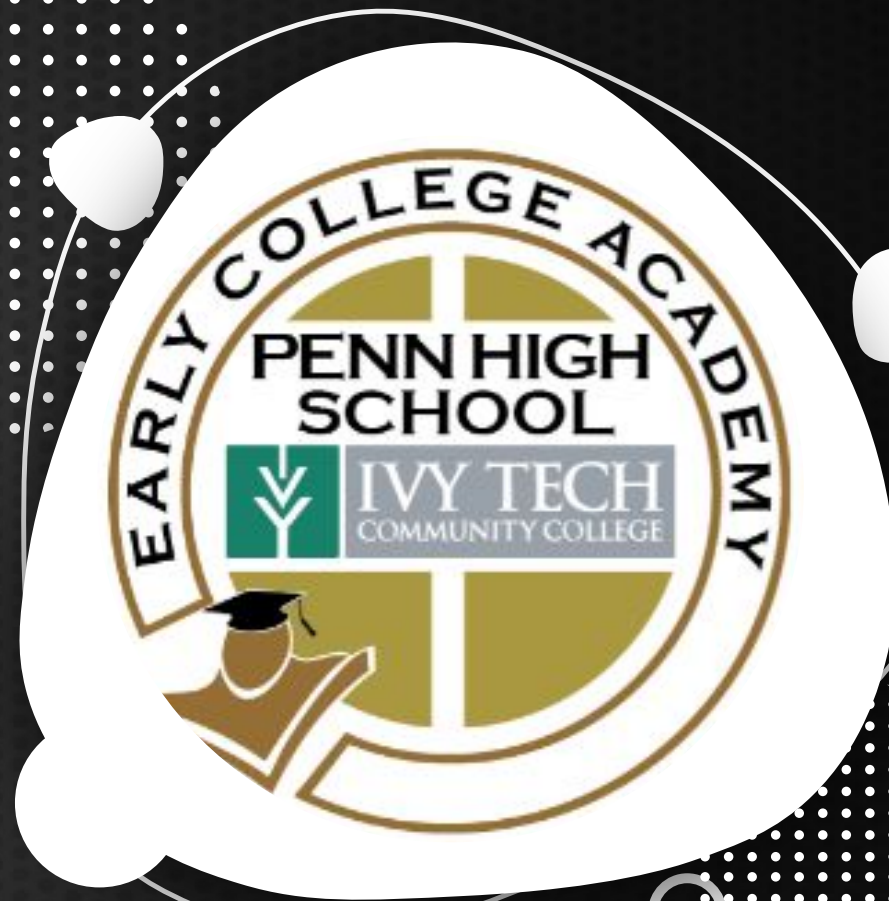

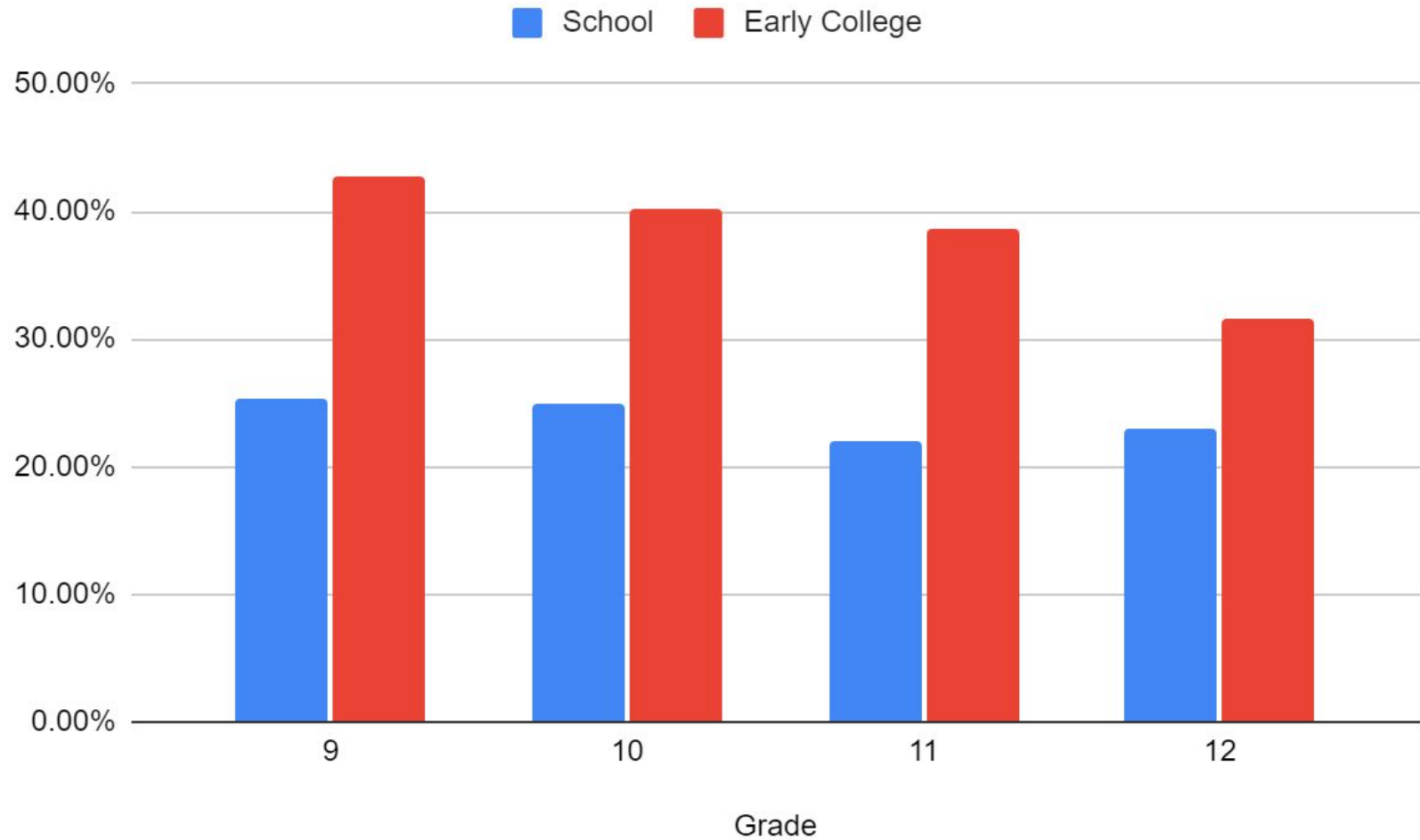

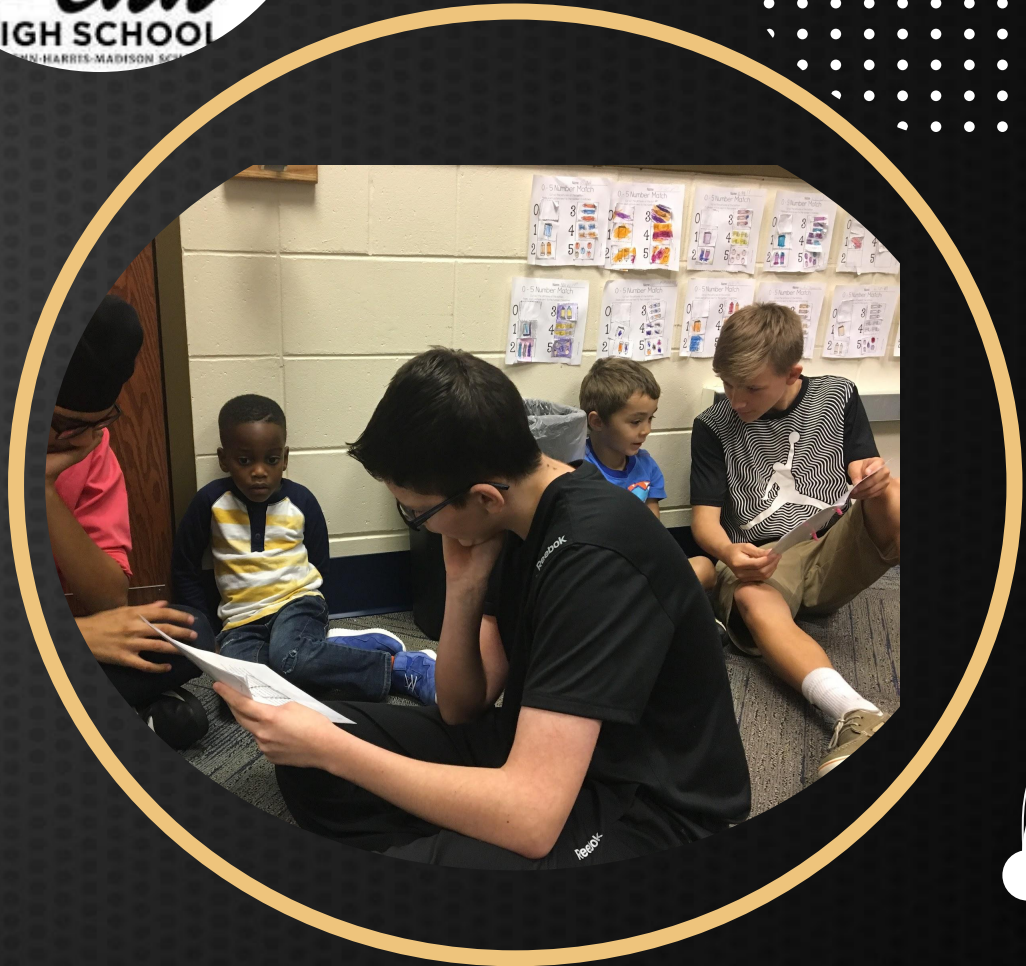

THERE ARE FREE TUTORING & SCHOOL SUPPORT OPTIONS FOR YOU!



Classroom Teacher Support:

Reaching out to your teacher is the first step in getting help! Let your teacher know you need support, and they can offer additional help, *sometimes* even outside of school hours.

Kingsmen Tutoring:

When given a pass by the school counselor, students can go to the IMC for tutoring during Study Hall. Tutoring is available for most core classes. Some teachers even have Kingsmen Tutors in their classes, so be sure to ask them.

Freshman and Sophomore After-School Study Tables:

A teacher for each core subject will be present to help students with homework or for tutoring -- 9th grade meets in room 125 until 4:00 and 10th Grade meets in room 119 until 3:55.

Junior Study Tables:

Juniors have a Study Tables class built into their schedule. This smaller version of Study Hall, designed exclusively for Early College students, is created to provide active support for students during the school day.

Ivy Tech Tutoring:

For Ivy Tech's dual credit classes, you have access to free tutoring resources that are available on Ivy Tech's campus and also through your MyIvy account. [Click here for a video tutorial.](#)

National Honor Society Tutoring:

Interested students can be connected with an NHS member for tutoring. Arrangements are made on a case-by-case basis.

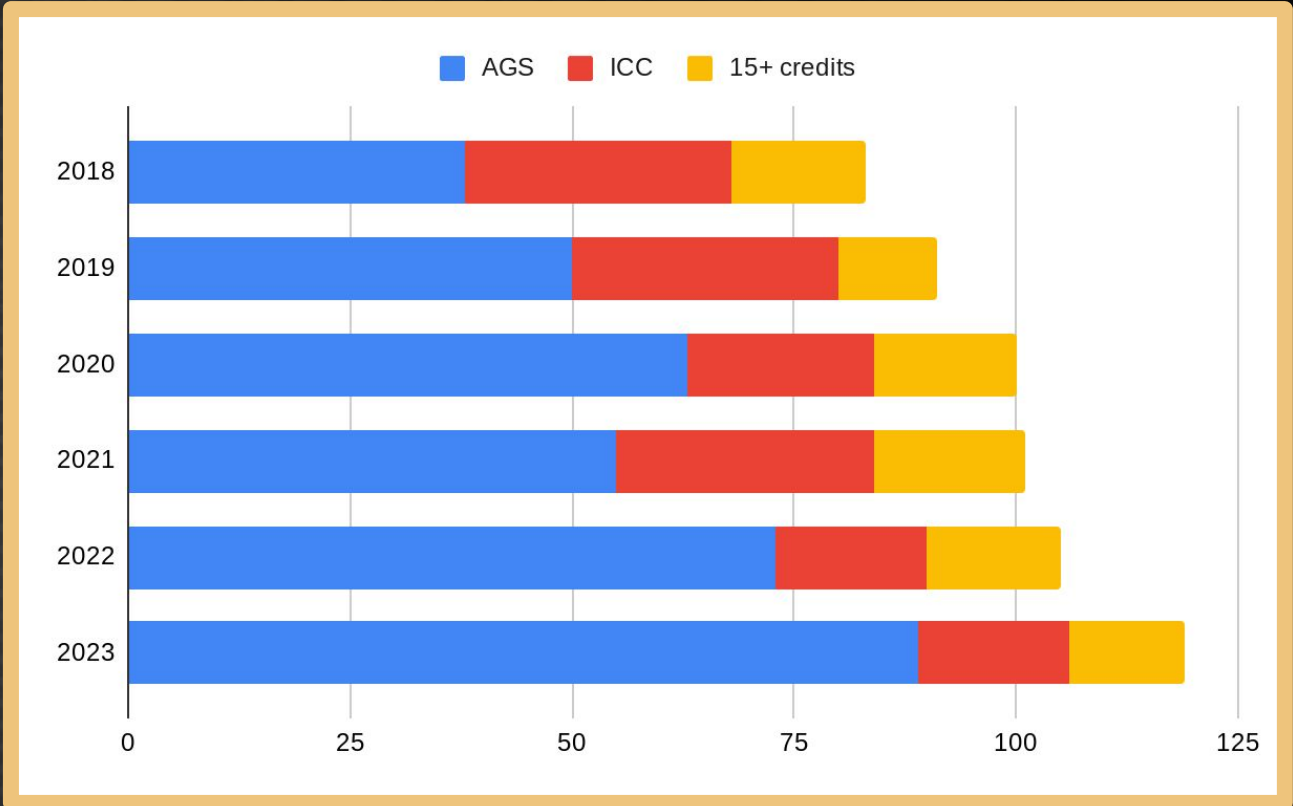
