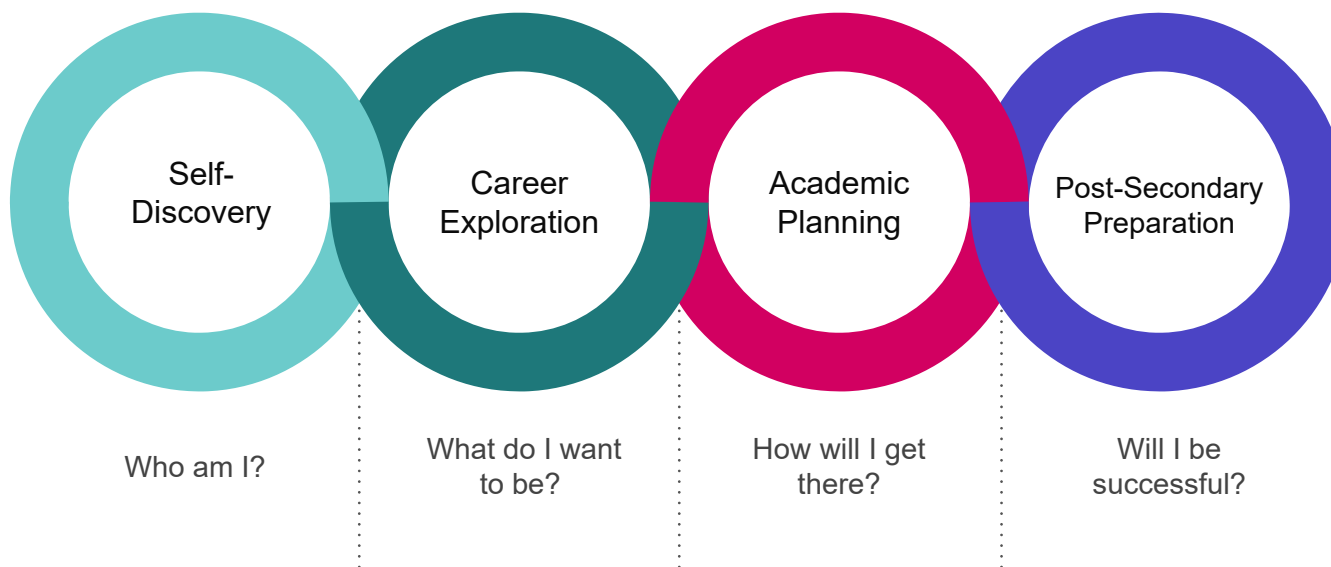

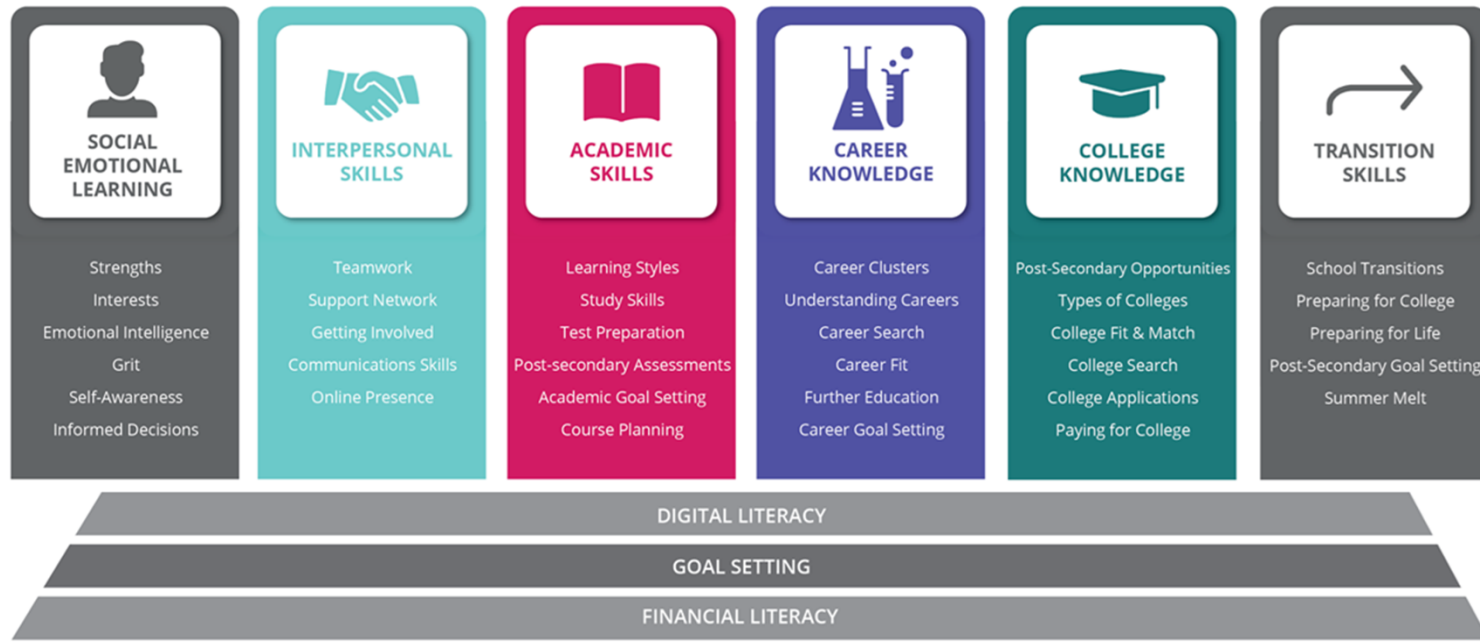

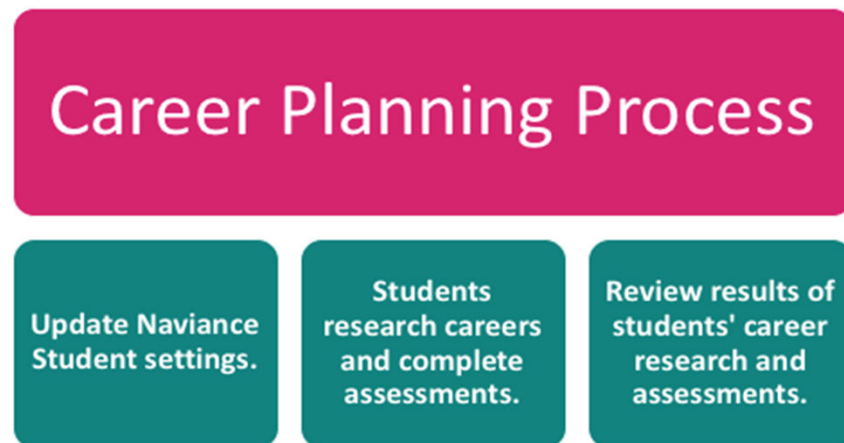

## What is Career Planning?

# Career Planning Glossary

**Career Pathways:** The groupings of career information into divisions within each Career Cluster (i.e. Banking Services, Insurance, Teaching & Training, etc.). There are 79 different Career Pathways.

**Career Profiles:** The most granular level of career information available in Naviance Student (i.e. Tellers, Actuaries, Librarians, Middle School Teachers, etc.). There are over 1,000 Career Profiles in Naviance Student.

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**Traditional:** Basic search functionality, i.e. type a college name, search by campus size or location, etc.

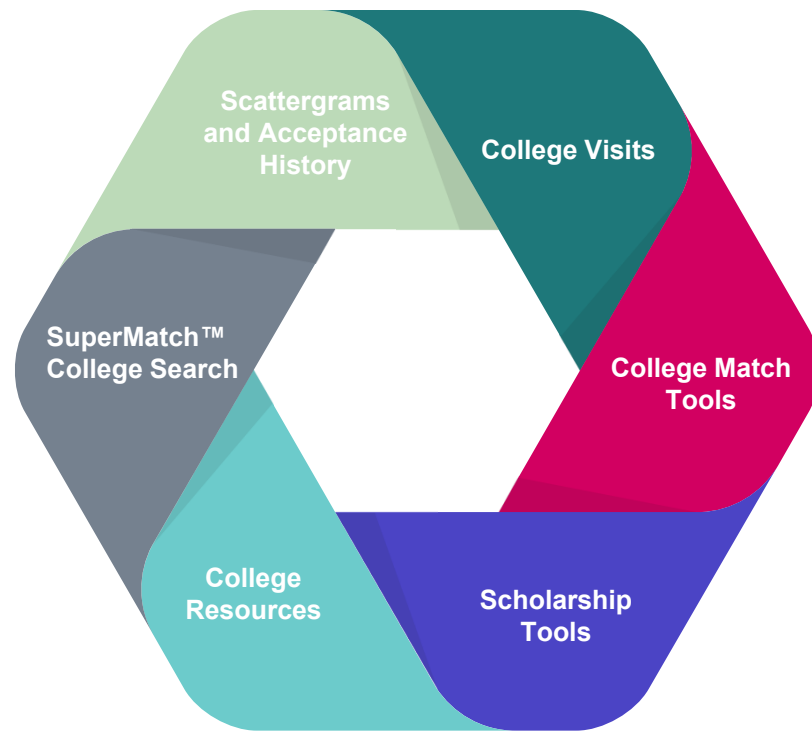

## What is Naviance eDocs?

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Starting in 20-21 School Year (high school only)

Naviance eDocs allows students to request transcripts and letters of recs from counselors and teachers to securely send student application related forms, recommendations, transcripts, and school profiles electronically to more than 2,000 colleges and universities.





## What is Course Planner?

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### 20-21 School Year

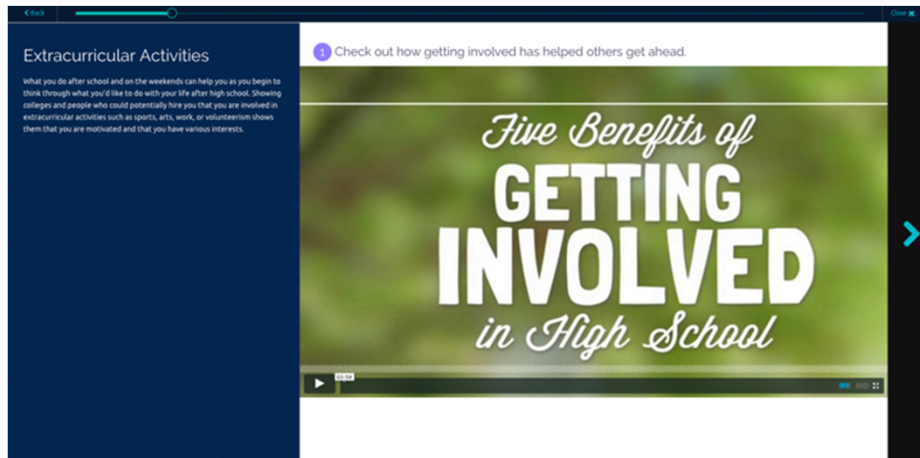
